**Question(s) for the Day: Genesis 6:9-22, 7:11-8:12, 20-22, 9:8-17**

1. What's the "bad news" you can identify in the story? For example, *"It's bad news that the earth was full of corruption and violence"* (6:11-12). What's the "good news" you can identify in the story? For example, *"It's good news that God still has a commitment to life, even as God has determined to blot out creation."*
2. Here's an unfortunately all-too-easy question: identify at least 3 pieces of "bad news" from today's headlines. Can you also identify any good news in the story? (I.e., Mr. Rogers once advised kids and parents, in scary times, to *"Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping."* God works in and through people. Have you heard any "helper stories" that might be good news?)
3. In what specific, concrete, REAL way might YOU be good news to someone this week?

### THE WORD—Genesis 6:9-22, 7:11-8:12, 20-22, 9:8-17

R The reading comes from the Old Testament book of Genesis, selections from chapters 6 through 9.

**Genesis 6—<sup>9</sup>** This is the account of Noah and his family.

Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God. <sup>10</sup>Noah had three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth.

<sup>11</sup> Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. <sup>12</sup> God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. <sup>13</sup> So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. <sup>14</sup> So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. <sup>15</sup> This is how you are to build it: The ark is to be three hundred cubits long, fifty cubits wide and thirty cubits high. <sup>16</sup> Make a roof for it, leaving below the roof an opening one cubit high all around. Put a door in the side of the ark and make lower, middle and upper decks. <sup>17</sup> I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. <sup>18</sup> But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark—you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you. <sup>19</sup> You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you. <sup>20</sup> Two of every kind of bird, of every kind of animal and of every kind of creature that moves along the ground will come to you to be kept alive. <sup>21</sup> You are to take every kind of food that is to be eaten and store it away as food for you and for them."

<sup>22</sup> Noah did everything just as God commanded him.

**Genesis 7 & 8--** <sup>11</sup> In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the seventeenth day of the second month—on that day all the springs of the great deep burst forth, and the

floodgates of the heavens were opened. <sup>12</sup> And rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights.

<sup>13</sup> On that very day Noah and his sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth, together with his wife and the wives of his three sons, entered the ark. <sup>14</sup> They had with them every wild animal according to its kind, all livestock according to their kinds, every creature that moves along the ground according to its kind and every bird according to its kind, everything with wings. <sup>15</sup> Pairs of all creatures that have the breath of life in them came to Noah and entered the ark. <sup>16</sup> The animals going in were male and female of every living thing, as God had commanded Noah. Then the LORD shut him in.

<sup>17</sup> For forty days the flood kept coming on the earth, and as the waters increased they lifted the ark high above the earth. <sup>18</sup> The waters rose and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the surface of the water. <sup>19</sup> They rose greatly on the earth, and all the high mountains under the entire heavens were covered. <sup>20</sup> The waters rose and covered the mountains to a depth of more than fifteen cubits. <sup>21</sup> Every living thing that moved on land perished—birds, livestock, wild animals, all the creatures that swarm over the earth, and all mankind. <sup>22</sup> Everything on dry land that had the breath of life in its nostrils died. <sup>23</sup> Every living thing on the face of the earth was wiped out; people and animals and the creatures that move along the ground and the birds were wiped from the earth. Only Noah was left, and those with him in the ark.

<sup>24</sup> The waters flooded the earth for a hundred and fifty days.

**8** But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark, and he sent a wind over the earth, and the waters receded. <sup>2</sup> Now the springs of the deep and the floodgates of the heavens had been closed, and the rain had stopped falling from the sky. <sup>3</sup> The water receded steadily from the earth. At the end of the hundred and fifty days the water had gone down, <sup>4</sup> and on the seventeenth day of the seventh month the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat. <sup>5</sup> The waters continued to recede until the tenth month, and on the first day of the tenth month the tops of the mountains became visible.

<sup>6</sup> After forty days Noah opened a window he had made in the ark <sup>7</sup> and sent out a raven, and it kept flying back and forth until the water had dried up from the earth. <sup>8</sup> Then he sent out a dove to see if the water had receded from the surface of the ground. <sup>9</sup> But the dove could find nowhere to perch because there was water over all the surface of the earth; so it returned to Noah in the ark. He reached out his hand and took the dove and brought it back to himself in the ark. <sup>10</sup> He waited seven more days and again sent out the dove from the ark. <sup>11</sup> When the dove returned to him in the evening, there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf! Then Noah knew that the water had receded from the earth. <sup>12</sup> He waited seven more days and sent the dove out again, but this time it did not return to him.

<sup>20</sup> Then Noah built an altar to the LORD and, taking some of all the clean animals and clean birds, he sacrificed burnt offerings on it. <sup>21</sup> The LORD smelled the pleasing aroma and said in his heart: "Never again will I curse the ground because of humans, even though every inclination of the human heart is evil from childhood. And never again will I destroy all living creatures, as I have done. <sup>22</sup> "As long as the earth endures,

seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease.”

**Genesis 9**--<sup>8</sup> Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him: <sup>9</sup> “I now establish my covenant with you and with your descendants after you <sup>10</sup> and with every living creature that was with you—the birds, the livestock and all the wild animals, all those that came out of the ark with you—every living creature on earth. <sup>11</sup> I establish my covenant with you: Never again will all life be destroyed by the waters of a flood; never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth.”

<sup>12</sup> And God said, “This is the sign of the covenant I am making between me and you and every living creature with you, a covenant for all generations to come: <sup>13</sup> I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth. <sup>14</sup> Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, <sup>15</sup> I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life. <sup>16</sup> Whenever the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and all living creatures of every kind on the earth.”

<sup>17</sup> So God said to Noah, “This is the sign of the covenant I have established between me and all life on the earth.”

- **Automatic Withdrawal**—Contact your bank.
- **By App**—Both the Apple and Google Play app stores have a free app called “GivePlus.” Once downloaded to your device, simply search for “Trinity Lutheran Church, Princeton, MN”; follow the directions for registering; and set-up your giving in whatever way works for your faithful generosity, one time, recurring, or whatever.

## HELP WANTED WITH WORSHIP TO HELP SING & TO RUN SOUND/CAMERA—WE NEED YOU!!!

If you have been tuning in to our worship broadcasts, you know that the whole Pancoast family has been integral in helping to lead our worship services. (Thanks, Olsen, Laura, Anna, & Eleanor!!) They have helped with both singing and, occasionally, running the tech.

In addition, TLC member Fred Street has been our main tech guy, while our office admin, Liz Christensen has been running our camera. (Thanks, Fred & Liz!!)

However, with the onset of summer, that has changed. (Olsen & Laura have reported to Christikon Lutheran Bible Camp in Montana to begin training for a summer of ministry out there. Fred needs a little break every once in a while, as well, and so will Liz.)

### SO HERE’S WHAT WE’RE LOOKING FOR:

- **A HANDFUL OF PEOPLE TO SING**—this will vary in number depending on who’s on tap to provide special music. But for the foreseeable future, even as we move into Phase 3 in the Stay Safe MN plan and the potential for in-person worship, we will also continue livestreaming our services that include music. And the very nature of the potential for spread means that we will still be limiting the number of singers.
- **A HANDFUL OF PEOPLE TO BE TRAINED IN on setting up the tech and running the sound for our Livestreams**—it’s not complicated or hard. But there some some steps.
- **A HANDFUL OF PEOPLE TO BE TRAINED IN on running the camera**—it’s basically point and track “the action” and is not complicated or hard. We just need people!

IN ORDER TO DO THIS...

- WE ARE STILL KEEPING OUR NUMBERS TO 10 OR FEWER FOR OUR LIVESTREAMED SERVICES.



- STILL--YOU MUST NOT be in a higher-risk category (i.e., 65-years or older; underlying health conditions; etc.) or exhibiting symptoms (coughing; etc.)
- YOU MUST be able to practice good physical distancing—6 ft. or more.
- YOU MUST be able to wear a mask. (NOTE: For this past Sunday's service, all our worship leaders wore masks. Since we are introducing additional people to the equation, we will be requiring ALL of our worship leaders to wear masks going forward.)
- YOU NEED TO BE PRESENT NO LATER THAN 8:30AM on SUNDAY MORNING—WE WILL TRAIN YOU ON THE EQUIPMENT!! (DON'T WORRY—IT'S EASIER THAN YOU THINK.)
- IF YOU CAN HELP OUT—AND WE REALLY, REALLY NEED YOU TO HELP OUT—PLEASE CONTACT PASTOR MIKE ([pastormike@trinity-princeton.org](mailto:pastormike@trinity-princeton.org) or 763-333-4499) ASAP, AND HE'LL FILL YOU IN WITH ANY OTHER DETAILS. THANKS!!!

## OFFICE UPDATES

As part of the first phase of reentry into our building, we will begin a preliminary return to summer hours:

- We will begin a move back in toward limited summer office hours TENTATIVELY beginning **Monday, June 15**.
- Our reentry to the office will begin with limited hours, as follows:

**Monday: 9am – 1pm** Liz only, except for Council Mondays (2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of the month), when at least one pastor will be present. (Mondays are typically the pastors' day off.)

**Tuesday – Thursday: 10am – 2pm** Liz will be present in the office. At least one pastor will be in at least TWO of those days.

**Fridays**—Summer office hours; the office is closed.

- Under Governor Walz's "Stay Safe MN" Plan, even workers at "Critical Businesses" (and the church is considered a "Critical Business") "*must telework if you can.*" ([www.staysafe.mn.gov](http://www.staysafe.mn.gov))
- This reentry will begin, provided that we can make sure we have adequate supplies on hand to protect our staff and congregation including disposable masks; hand sanitizer; sanitizing wipes; bleach; spray bottles; etc., most of which we already have on hand.
- Office doors will remain locked for the time being until, as with worship reentry, we experience 14 days of declining case numbers.
- **If you can continue to conduct business with the office via phone, PLEASE DO.**
- The pastors WILL offer in-person pastoral care by appointment.

Masks will be required.

Pastor Mike will receive visitors in his office, provided they can maintain a physical distance of 6 feet. (We'll invite people to come to Pastor Mike's office through the sanctuary entrance.)

Pastor Kari's office is too small, so she will receive visitors elsewhere in the building where physical distancing and privacy can be maintained.



In the event that visitors are received for pastoral care, a thorough sanitizing process will occur, wiping down all surfaces contacted by visitors after they have left.

- We will continue to encourage you who might be in higher risk categories to stay home and conduct business by phone.

The pastors will begin developing strategies for conducting home visits in a safe, physically distant way (i.e., at least 6 feet away, outdoors, through a slightly opened window, etc.) but will continue to use their phones for most connections and checking in.

- PLEASE do not come to the office for any reason...
  - ...if you are feeling ill or exhibiting any kind of respiratory symptom (coughing, sneezing, etc.);
  - ...if you have been exposed to Covid-19;
  - ...if you have a compromised immune system (chemotherapy patients, etc.); or
  - ...if you are at a higher risk of exposing others (i.e., nursing home employees, etc.).
- Each work day will end by spraying and wiping down all work surfaces and all entry/exit portals.
