INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY—Jeremiah’s Letter to the Exiles

Last week, we heard from the prophet Amos who proclaimed that even though God’s people, especially those wealthy enough to do so, had built “beautiful stone houses” and had planted “lush vineyards,” they would not get to enjoy them, or at least, they wouldn’t get to enjoy them for very long. Why? This is what God said through the prophet Amos: “You trample the poor, stealing their grain through taxes and unfair rent. ... You oppress good people by taking bribes and deprive the poor of justice in the courts” (5:11-12).



And indeed—that is exactly what happened. In 722 BC, the Assyrian Empire wiped out the northern kingdom of Israel, and in 587 BC, the Babylonian Empire conquered the southern kingdom of Judah, tearing down the once-thought impregnable walls of Jerusalem and razing the Temple built by Solomon to the ground.

Looking back in hindsight, God’s people faced a crisis of identity and of faith: “If we are God’s people... If God has promised never to abandon us, WHY and HOW could this happen?!”

And the answer? Well, the reason we have the prophets we do in the Old Testament is because IN HINDSIGHT their words of warning and calling—to examine one’s faith, piety and practice in relationship to our connection with the poor, hungry, and unwelcome—were proven to be true! In other words, the way the kings and nation were judged by God through the prophets—their worship and their sense of justice for the downtrodden—were the reasons for the upheaval God’s people experienced and their captivity in Babylon.

But all of those prophets’ warnings of destruction were not the final Word from God. In fact, most of those prophets in one breath spoke those oracles of warning and in the next promising that God would not abandon his people. So we hear today in Jeremiah’s “Letter to the Exiles.”

R The Word comes to us today from the Old Testament prophet, Jeremiah, Chapter 29.

R Jeremiah wrote a letter from what was left of Jerusalem to the elders, priests, prophets, and all the people who had been exiled to Babylon by King Nebuchadnezzar.

⁴This is what the LORD of Heaven’s Armies, the God of Israel, says to all the captives he has exiled to Babylon from Jerusalem: ⁵“Build homes, and plan to stay. Plant gardens, and eat the food they produce. ⁶Marry and have children. Then find spouses for them so that you may have many grandchildren. Multiply! Do not dwindle away! ⁷And work for the peace and prosperity of the city where I sent you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, for its welfare will determine your welfare.”

⁸This is what the LORD of Heaven’s Armies, the God of Israel, says: “Do not let your prophets and fortune-tellers who are with you in the land of Babylon trick you. Do not listen to their dreams, ⁹because they are telling you lies in my name. I have not sent them,” says the LORD.

¹⁰This is what the LORD says: “You will be in Babylon for seventy years. But then I will come and do for you all the good things I have promised, and I will bring you home again. ¹¹For I know the plans I have for you,” says the LORD. “They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. ¹²In

those days when you pray, I will listen. ¹³If you look for me wholeheartedly, you will find me. ¹⁴I will be found by you,” says the LORD. “I will end your captivity and restore your fortunes. I will gather you out of the nations where I sent you and will bring you home again to your own land.”

Not a month... and often not a WEEK goes by that we don't get a call from someone or from one of our partner congregations (Christ Our Light, New Life, and/or Bethel Christian Reformed, most frequently) to help with rental or utility assistance, vehicle repairs, shelter from an abusive relationship, and/or transient shelter. When the fund balance drops below \$1,000, we have put out an appeal for recharging it. **If you can find it within your generosity to help with recharging that fund, we want to INVITE you to do so.
